UNIT 1:

- VOCABULARY: spelling and pronunciation, lost sounds.
- EVERYDAY ENGLISH: giving opinions, making an opinion stronger.
- SPEAKING: a Shakespearean tragedy, what do you think?.
- WRITING: telling a story, writing a folk tale or fairy tale.

UNIT 4:

- GRAMMAR: advice, obligation and permission (modal and related verbs).
- VOCABULARY: phrasal verbs.
- EVERYDAY ENGLISH: polite requests and offers.
- SPEAKING: discussion, what do you think?.
- WRITING: a biography, researching facts about a famous person and writing a biography.

UNIT 5:

- GRAMMAR: future forms (will, going to or present continuous?; future possibilities – may, might, could).
- VOCABULARY: word building (suffixes, prefixes, changing word stress).
- EVERYDAY ENGLISH: arranging to meet.
- SPEAKING: discussion, what do you think?, roleplay.
- WRITING: writing for talking, writing a talk about an issue that concerns you.
